INTRODUCTION

The New York City Department of Education, Office of Nonpublic Schools, is offering graduate courses in administration and supervision through the colleges and universities listed in this catalog. Participants may enroll in a degree program leading to New York State certification as a School Building Leader. The *Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)*, Title IIA Professional Development Program, provides assistance for this initiative.

The target audience for this initiative will be talented **nonpublic** schoolteachers, **currently working within the 5 (five) boroughs of New York City**, who are aspiring to become principals as well as current principals wishing to enroll in courses in order to acquire the necessary credits for New York State certification as a School Building Leader. Approved applicants may also include school personnel who currently are certified by New York State in administration and supervision and may wish to enroll in selected courses in order to remain current in the field. **Please note that you should not request enrollments if you are planning to leave the non-public school or are moving to a different nonpublic school, as you may not be eligible to use Title IIA funds from your current school. You must notify the Title IIA office immediately at abaumis@schools.nyc.gov if your employment status/location changes.**

NOTE: Confirmations given for Fall 2025 SBL enrollments will be contingent upon the availability of active contracts with each college/university.

Procedures for Requesting Enrollment: Applicants

Requesting enrollments for Fall 2025 SBL courses will take place online June 2, 2025 and will end on Friday, June 13, 2025 at 3:00 PM. Please note that this deadline is for requesting an enrollment as well as having the request affirmed online by your principal. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that the enrollment request has been affirmed the school principal. If you are a principal requesting enrollment, you must still affirm your own request for enrollment using the school login and password on PROTRAXX. If a request for enrollment as well as the affirmation by the school principal is not completed within the above timeframe, the student will not be able to participate in the Title IIA program for Fall 2025.

Due to the availability of Title IIA funds for this initiative, a limited number of participants will be permitted to participate in the program.





FINAL CONFIRMATION COMES FROM THE OFFICE OF NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS (TITLE IIA) IN THE FORM OF AN EMAIL THAT IS SENT THROUGH PROTRAXX. THIS OCCURS WITHIN APPROXIMATELY 2 WEEKS AFTER THE CLOSE OF ENROLLMENT ON PROTRAXX.

Only those participants who have been accepted will receive notification, via email, confirming their registration in a Title IIA SBL course. It is the participant's responsibility to contact the Title IIA office prior to the beginning of a class in the event that an email is not received regarding the status of their enrollment request. Missing a course as a result of not knowing your request was confirmed may lead to your being prohibited from taking Title IIA Courses/Workshops for 1 year.

Title IIA Cancellation Policy

It is expected that anyone with a confirmed enrollment for a course will attend since not participating will result in another applicant being excluded from a given course. Please do not sign up for courses or workshops you **do not intend** to participate in. *You will be allowed to cancel one course per semester without a penalty as long as there is a legitimate reason.*

To Cancel/Withdraw Attendance in a Title IIA Course:

You **must** follow all the following procedures if you need to withdraw from a class after the beginning date. Withdrawing after the beginning of a class should only occur in an emergency situation. As this action may incur a charge to the Title IIA program, a withdrawal from a class after the class has started may result in being **prevented from participating** in the Title IIA Professional Development Program for the **upcoming year**. In order to withdraw from a course after the start date, please follow **all** the instructions below. Please note that after the beginning of a course, you will not be able to withdraw on PROTRAXX.

Description: The course focuses on the systematic observation and planned participation in the administrative and supervisory activities of an urban or suburban school. The course, with its partner course ASGE 6521, focuses on the real role of the school leader in terms of ethical and legal responsibilities, knowledge of budgeting, the use of instructional data, and the necessary disposition needed to ensure that all students in the schools they will lead will have the greatest opportunity for academic success. Prerequisite: Students must have completed 18 -24 credits before applying. Note: Interns must complete a total of 220 hours for Internship I – approximately 16-18 hours per week in a school. It is recommended that students exceed the 220 hours course minimum. Interns and the host school principal will be visited several times on site by the Professor. In addition to the first session, there will be 7 seminar sessions held throughout the semester; sites and dates of the seminar sessions will be determined collaboratively by the Professor and interns at the first session. Site visits will also be collaboratively scheduled by the Professor with the intern and host principal.
