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Back by popular demand, this is a repeat of the March 14, 2018 workshop.

We use executive functioning skills to get organized, plan ahead, follow directions, cope with changes and transitions, control our impulses, and manage our emotions. These skills continue developing until late adolescence and almost every child in elementary school struggles to use these skills effectively.

This workshop will review what we know about executive functioning skills and the impact this set of skills has on learning. Assessment tools will be presented to help teachers quickly identify specific areas of weaknesses that are impacting students in their classroom.

Finally, classroom-wide strategies and individualized interventions will be discussed for supporting weaknesses in executive functioning skills and promoting the development of these abilities.
